This recommendation is specifically to accept the cul-de-sac portion of Lexus Place as shown on the plat for the Lexus Place Subdivision which was recorded in the Putnam County Register of Deeds Office on January 13, 2004 in Plat Cabinet D, Pages 144A – 144A, Instrument # 22168 and Record # 16686. The recorded plat shows the road terminating in a temporary cul-de-sac because the developer was contemplating further development at the time the original plat was approved and recorded. The main section of the road has already been approved and placed on the county road list. I have attached copies of the final inspection report and the recorded plat for the committee to review. There is no requirement for a warranty contract on this newly completed portion of the road.

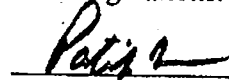

The Chairman asked for question on the motion.

Sonya Brown of Brown Properties spoke to the Commission regarding the motion.

Commissioner Mike Medley spoke on the motion and stated that the road doesn't meet specifications that the subdivision regulations state. Commissioner Medley stated that there is over 15% grade, the pavement is cracking on the road, and it looks like a creek running down the middle of the road where water has went under it. Commissioner Mike Medley recommended not to accept this road.

Commissioner Ron Chaffin inquired as to whether the Brown's had engineers review the road to which Sonya Brown said no.

Commissioner Gene Mullins stated that he drove his V-8 Mustang on the road and had to drop down into 2nd gear to go up the hill, with his hand held GPS. It indicated a grade of 20%, well above recommendations. Google Earth has contour mapping data and shared a grade of 20%. Commissioner Gene Mullins stated that he went down the hill and had to drop into first gear due to the speed. He stated that he would not put a county vehicle in jeopardy. The Turnberry Place section is extremely rippled. The entire road was rippled. He stated that he found a pot hole at the bottom of the road which shows the pavement was not as thick as it should have been. Commissioner Gene Mullins stated that he was inclined to agree with the recommendation of the Road Committee.

The County Attorney, Jeff Jones, spoke to the Commission and stated that there is a difference between approval of a plat and approval of the dedication of a road. He stated that no governmental agency has approved the dedication of this road. In fact, Algood Planning Commission refused to recommend acceptance. County Attorney, Jeff Jones, stated that no governmental agency has recommended acceptance of the road.

The Chairman asked the Commissioners to vote on the motion to approve the following roads be added to the Official County Road Map: Plantation View from Brotherton Road at 1,800 feet, Plantation Lane at 551 feet, Plantation Way at 357 feet, Auguste Circle at 756 feet, Hunter Hills Lane, Winchester Drive, Lexus Place (cul-de-sac portion), King's Court, Bishop Trace, Castlebrook Lane (cul-de-sac portion), Hickory Cove, Bradshaw Boulevard, Parker Place, and Pearl Avenue.

RESOLUTION NO. ____

RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A PROGRAM TO SUPPLEMENT THE PROPERTY TAX RELIEF PROGRAM OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE PROVIDED FOR IN TITLE 67, CHAPTER 5, PART 7 OF THE *TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED*.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Putnam County has recognized the need to provide financial assistance to certain needy citizens of this county; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee, through its General Assembly, has established a program whereby elderly low-income homeowners, as those taxpayers are defined in *Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 67, Chapter 5, Part 7*, are provided financial assistance through a refund of property taxes paid for by a state appropriation; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly, in passing Chapter 739 of the Public Acts of 2006, amended *Tennessee Code Annotated § 67-5-701(j)* to provide that any county, municipality, or metropolitan government may provide for the appropriation of additional funds to supplement this program for tax relief for elderly low-income homeowners:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of Putnam County, Tennessee, meeting in REG. session on this 17TH day of SEPT., 2007, at Cookeville, Tennessee, that;

SECTION 1. The Board of Commissioners of Putnam hereby expresses its intent to exercise the authority provided in *Tennessee Code Annotated § 67-5-701(j)* to provide financial assistance to elderly low-income homeowners, as those taxpayers are defined in *Tennessee Code Annotated § 67-5-702*.

SECTION 2. Only those taxpayers who qualify under *Tennessee Code Annotated § 67-5-702* are eligible for this additional tax relief.

SECTION 3. In order to receive this tax relief, any eligible taxpayer shall have previously applied for and obtained the relief authorized by *Tennessee Code Annotated § 67-5-702* by the State of Tennessee.

SECTION 4. The tax relief authorized by this resolution shall be in an amount determined by annual appropriation and shall be subject to the availability of funds. The amount of tax relief provided to eligible taxpayers shall be up to \$95.⁰⁰, per residence, provided, that in no event shall the total relief allowed by the state and the county exceed the total taxes actually paid. Subject to the maximum amount of tax relief per residence as stated in the previous sentence, the amount of tax relief per residence shall be calculated using the formula stated in *Tennessee Code Annotated § 67-5-702*.

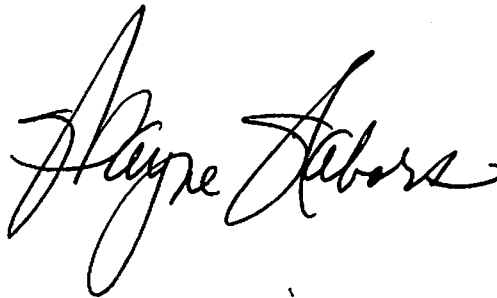
SECTION 5. The provisions of this resolution shall be administered through the Office of the County Trustee in the same manner as the property tax relief program of the State of Tennessee provided for in Tennessee Code Annotated §§ 67-5-701 – 67-5-702.

SECTION 6. This Resolution shall be effective upon its passage and approval. the public welfare requiring it.

INTRODUCTION - Performs professional natural resources conservation work of routine difficulty and related work as required under immediate supervision of the Conservation District and /or Natural Resources Conservation Service employees.

DUTIES - (1) Assists with the overall information and education program of the Soil Conservation District by attending various conservation related meetings and by preparing news articles and scripts for radio, school, groups and organizations.

(2) Assist in developing, designing, and layout with landowners in applying multiple conservation measures, such as strip cropping, conservation tillage practices, surface irrigation, nutrient and pesticide management, conservation cropping or combinations thereof.

(3) Explains cost-share programs and procedures to landowners, inspects and inventories proposed conservation practice construction sites, performs site layout work, reviews construction of conservation and water quality practices for compliance with technical specifications, recommends payment to landowners under cost-sharing provision where conservation practices have been properly completed.

(4) Prepares and maintains records and reports as necessary using office equipment such as fax, copiers, computers and printers.

(5) Gives advice to urban landowners converting land to commercial, residential, recreational, or educational used on appropriate conservation methods such as erosion and sediment control practices, including their capabilities, and interprets past flooding data.

(6) Determines need and designs, with NRCS supervision, standards and specifications, earthen dams, water tanks, heavy use areas, animal waste systems, etc. to livestock producers.

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(7) Conducts engineering surveys, interprets engineering drawings and performs construction inspection.

(8) The incumbent is required to serve as an incidental motor vehicle operator which requires the operation of a motor vehicle on both public and private roads during daylight hours and occasionally after dark. A Valid State of Tennessee drivers' license is required.

(9) The incumbent must be able to work well and get along with co-workers, individual landowners, units of government, other agencies, contractors, farm operators, and community residents.

(10) The work requires regular and recurring physical exertion related to conservation work required prolonged walking on rough terrain, bending, lifting, stretching when setting up survey equipment and instruments, jumping ditches and furrows or climbing steep banks.

(11) The work involves regular exposure to earth-moving equipment, agriculture operation equipment including tractors, and attached implements such as cultivators, discs, and plows. At times there may be exposure to adverse weather conditions such as snow, icy and wet field conditions, and herbicide and chemical spray operations requiring safety precaution.

(12) Assist in gathering and preparing conservation farm plans and maintains a variety of other records and reports.

(13) Conducts conservation practices demonstration involving the use of all conservation practices, as well as new practices as they become available, that are applicable to this area.

(14) Assist in activities of the district field office as assigned to include maintenance of equipment, special reports, safety, support of civil rights rules and regulations to ensure their integration into delivery of programs.

REQUIREMENTS - Conservation or Agriculture background desirable. A State of Tennessee Drivers' License required.
